## **Keep your distance in the Peak District**

We wanted to take the opportunity to update you ahead of this weekend, given the likelihood of more visitors to our National Park and many people's understandable concerns about this.



Maintain social distancing of two metres for your own safety and others

STAY ALERT > CONTROL THE VIRUS > SAVE LIVES

As the lockdown restrictions begin to lift, we should be mindful that these are just the first gentle steps and therefore we would like to see just a small step back into our National Park. The National Park has 38,000 residents, some of whom are incredibly vulnerable and extremely anxious about keeping their distance and many of the facilities you come to expect here are closed.

With the announcement from the Health Secretary yesterday evening that the R number is creeping up dangerously close to 1, the level at which more restrictions will have to be re-introduced, people must be cautious and responsible in their actions; not only for their own direct communities but for all our communities around the country.

With one third of the UK population within an hour's drive of the Peak District, it's even more vital that we **Stay Alert**, **Control the Virus** & **Save Lives**.

We recognise the benefit to public health and all our wellbeing that outside space provides. At this stage, however, people should think carefully and make responsible choices about where they go. We are appealing to you to consider if local green space can provide you with that important breathing space you need at this time. If you do choose to visit the National Park, please take note of the recommended guidance above and maintain social distancing at all times.

Our national park will be there for people to enjoy in the weeks and months to come. As Her Majesty The Queen said:

"Better days will return: we will be with our friends again; we will be with our families again; we will meet again.
